Traditional prayers

Examen ("Examine")	The Examen is a method of reviewing your day in the presence of God. It's actually an attitude more than a method, a time set aside for thankful reflection on where God is in your everyday life. It has five steps, which most people take more or less in order, and it usually takes 15 to 20 minutes per day. Here it is in a nutshell: 1

Make yourself comfortable as you settle in for a time your body and your mind, becoming aware that your	
Lectio (read)	
Listen to the first person read the passage aloud. S the passage. What word or phrase speaks to your h speak that word or phrase aloud.	·

Meditatio (reflect)
Listen to the second person read the passage aloud, keeping in mind the word or phrase that first spoke to you. Spend a few moments in quiet reflection on what God may be saying to you through this word or phrase. When the group is invited to speak, share what this word or phrase means to you.
Oratio (respond)
Listen to the third person read the passage aloud. Spend a few moments in quiet reflection on how God may be calling you to act through the word or phrase that spoke to you. When the group is invited to speak, share how you feel God may be calling you to respond.

Contemplatio (rest)

Closing prayer of thanksgiving for our encounter with God's word.

Other traditional prayers
